

# P21S translates into a safer, easier wheel cleaner

It's amazing the number of people who spend hundreds of dollars on fancy wheels for their new car and then do little or nothing to keep them in good shape.

Many others spend a lot of money on aftermarket alloy wheels, clean them every weekend with a brand name wheel cleaner—and watch in horror as those wheels continue to corrode.

The problem is that some wheel cleaners are themselves corrosive. Their acid or high-alkaline base

can often strip the wheel's coating, attack the alloy itself and, if it is spilled on the bodywork, damage the car's paint, too.

Fortunately, there is an answer—albeit an expensive one—in the form of P21S. Made in West Germany, it has been available in Europe and the United States for several years but has shown up only sporadically in Canada.

Now a local importer and distributor will soon make it available in Southern Ontario department stores and automotive accessory dealers.

P21S is a water-based detergent invented by a chemist in 1976. It is guaranteed not to harm any type of wheel, whether it be alloy, chrome, painted, clear lacquered, polished or anodized.

Tested and approved by the TUV, the tough West German automotive technical testing organization, P21S is recommended by Audi, BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Porsche and Volvo.


From personal experience with the product over several years (relatives brought mine in from England), I can vouch for its effec-

tiveness. It is particularly good at removing corrosive brake dust.

The only drawback is the price. At \$19.95 per bottle it is not cheap, but it should last up to a year.

The same company also makes a windshield washer booster (\$9.95) that prevents smearing, and a motorcycle cleaner (\$19.95) which cleans the whole bike — paint, engine, chrome, vinyl, leather, etc.

### SPEED

Greg Miller, with assistence offered from OHMOG, will take his superb talents for running a first class <u>AUTOCROSS</u> to a first class autocross facility in the back parking lots at nearby Valley Mall. Safety will be enhanced as will the ability to "open up" the course. Nearby eating facilities, adjacent grassy knolls, as well a possible concurrent running of the <u>GYMKANA</u> (probable MOG SOUTH repeat), will enable this year's "speed and skill" events to be enjoyed by both entrants <u>and</u> spectators.

### VARIETY

No site would be complete without diversions for those not wishing to be totally absorbed in the "Main Events". Jay Dorsk has volunteered to Chair the DARTS competition, which will be staged in the central "Back Porch" area. In addition, the lists of local features is lengthy: 1. Restaurant selection - from the basic motel selections to your pick of Chinese, steaks, seafood, and other specialty restaurants (even two Mennonite restaurants). Maybe even a run to Brown's Restaurant (Chinese) in Luray ?! 2. Shopping -choices including local shops, nearby Valley Mall, and numerous antique shops. 3. Kid places - nearby pizza places, other fast food, minature golf, bowling, and movie theatres. 4. Points of interest - nearby caverns, historic battlefields, area wineries (tour organized at last MOG at Luray). The list goes on....

## LOCAL SUPPORT FEATURES

The presence of a local support features (not the least of which is numerous auto parts stores) make this locale an attractive location. The Belle Meade is located at the southern edge of the city - not too close and yet not too far away. Harrisonburg is basically a large rural town with a mixture of farm influence blended with college students ( James Madison Univ., Bridgewater College, Eastern Mennonite College). In addition to the basic site features, the "Belle Meade" is right off Interstate 81 (exit 62), making access much improved. The mountain venue, with its cool nights and less humid climate, also makes weather less of a problem. To top if off, Chuck Cline, a long time local and MCCDC member, has volunteered to assist us in any way needed -

Over 125 rooms have been reserved for Mog 17 attendees. You should have few problems obtaining accommodations on site. There are 60 rooms available with one double bed (1-2 persons, additional small kid(s) could be accommodated) at \$32.00/night plus tax. Another 65 rooms with 2 double beds at \$35.00/night plus tax (1-4 persons, again, which could possibly accomodate an additional kid or two) are also available. A few King bed rooms available (middle and front areas only- see below). I was not quoted an exact price, but I would assume they would be in the same ball park - be sure to get a quote on these.

To be sure of getting the type of room you want, CALL EARLY AND MAKE A RESERVATION! The Belle Meade will NOT give you a specific room, but will do its best to acommodate your wishes.

Most of the "action" will be behind the back section of the Belle Meade (pool, parties, Concours, etc.). If you want to be there, you may wish to specify a "back" room. If you want more peace and quiet, you may wish to request of room in the "middle" area. "Front" rooms (on Rt. 11) have advantages and disadvantages, though perfectly OK.
